


#### The Role of ER



## RIPE NCC-organised Events






Events organised by RIPE NCC 1 January 2015 to now

#### Regional Challenges: Europe



- Complexity of regulatory scene
  - How do we keep up with developments affecting RIPE NCC, our membership, RIPE community
  - Ambitious EU agenda, including the Digital Single Market, new IoT concerns
  - ...what does that mean for non-EU European states?
- Engaging all members in Europe
  - Diverse levels of development, economy, industry size

#### Regional Challenges: CIS



- Large, new(-ish) membership for us to engage
  - Challenges for RIPE NCC operations, PDP involvement
  - Huge area
- Need for capacity building, development, infrastructure
  - Particularly in Caucasus, Central Asia
- Need to understand government structures and priorities
  - Geopolitical conflicts and challenges
  - In Russia: Government ICT strategy and priorities fragmented across many structures and organisations

#### Regional Challenges: Middle East



- Need for capacity development
- A very different market structure, business approach (to European models)
  - How do we ensure RIPE NCC is "at home" in the region?
- Different perspectives on the services RIPE NCC offers
  - Requiring a different approach to service delivery and support
- Maintain the advances we've made with governments in the region

#### **Future Challenges**



- Evolving membership
  - Who are our new members, how can RIPE NCC serve their needs?
- Evolving Internet governance landscape
  - New issues: "Critical Internet Resources" isn't the battle it was in the past
  - New players: IG issues and concerns spreading to other arenas
- IoT
  - What does it mean for RIPE and the RIPE NCC?
- Security, law enforcement (including ICANN PSWG)
- Collaborating with industry partners: GSMA, W3C, SDOs, other I\* orgs...
