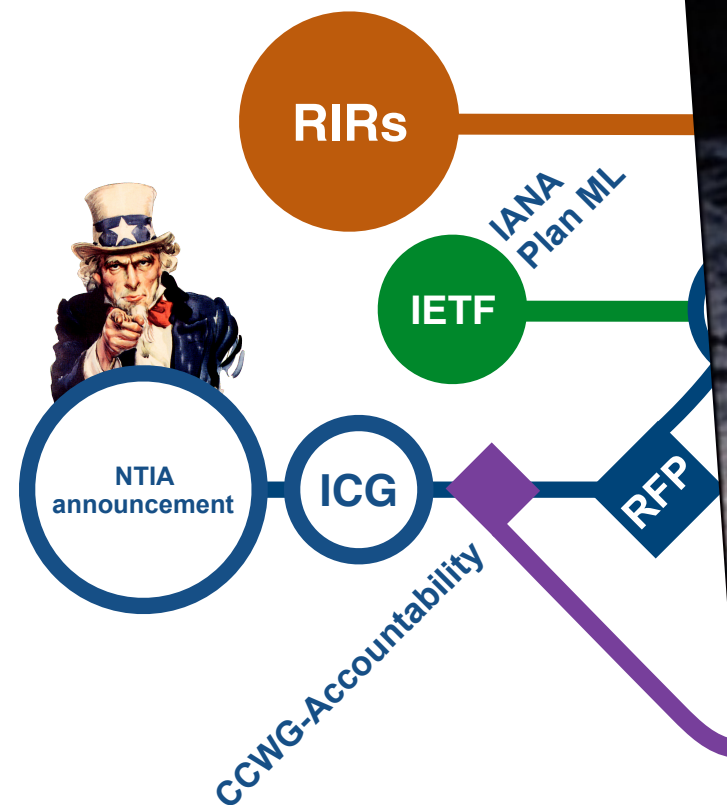

# The IANA Stewardship Package submitted!

---

- The ICANN 55 meeting saw agreement on the final element of the IANA stewardship “package”, the CCWG recommendations on ICANN accountability
- Culmination of the Internet’s largest single, global, multistakeholder policy development project!

# Challenges Along the Way

---

- Time
  - Very aggressive timelines
  - Other communities needed more time
- Other IANA communities
  - The NTIA required one single unified proposal
    - Different challenges for other communities
    - ICANN Accountability
- ICANN / NTIA / US gov
  - SLA negotiations with ICANN
  - Speculations about NTIA position, other US political actors



# CRISP Team Priorities

---

- Committed to the success of this transition
- Transparency throughout the discussion process
- Respect for principles agreed to in the CRISP proposal

# Work in the CRISP Team

---

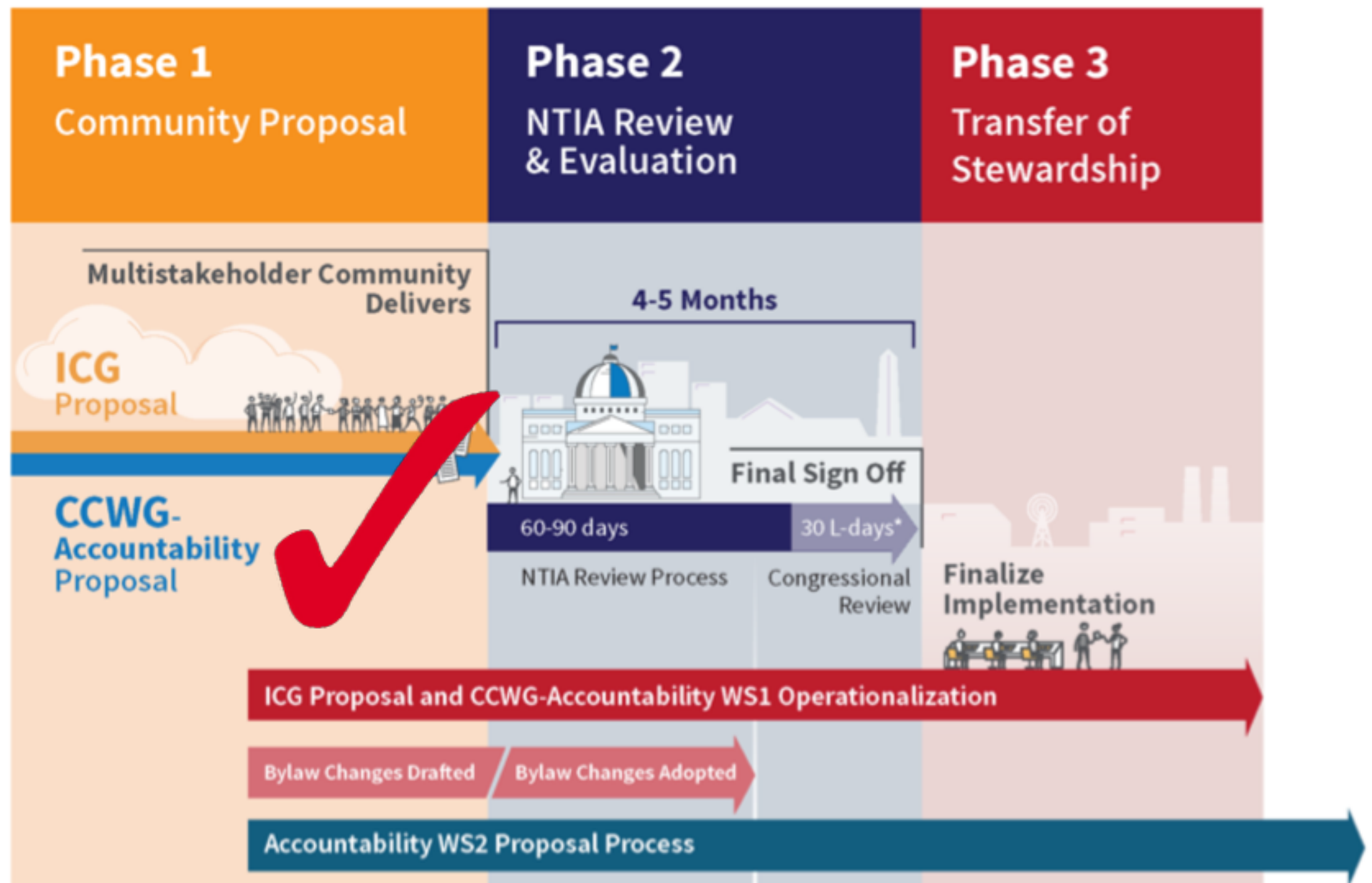
- Liaising with other parties (ICG, the RIRs)
- Ensure CRISP proposal integrity
- Developing solution to intellectual property (IPR) issues
- Review of SLA drafts
- CRISP team work now finalised
  - Work handed over to RIRs for implementation!

# Where Are We Now?

---

- On 10 March, following ICANN 55 Meeting, the “package” was sent to NTIA, which included:
  - ICG proposal on IANA stewardship
  - Recommendations on ICANN accountability
- The NTIA (and the U.S. Government) will take up to 30 legislative days to consider the package
  - Hoping for a decision in the next month or so...

- RIR legal team and RIR CEOs

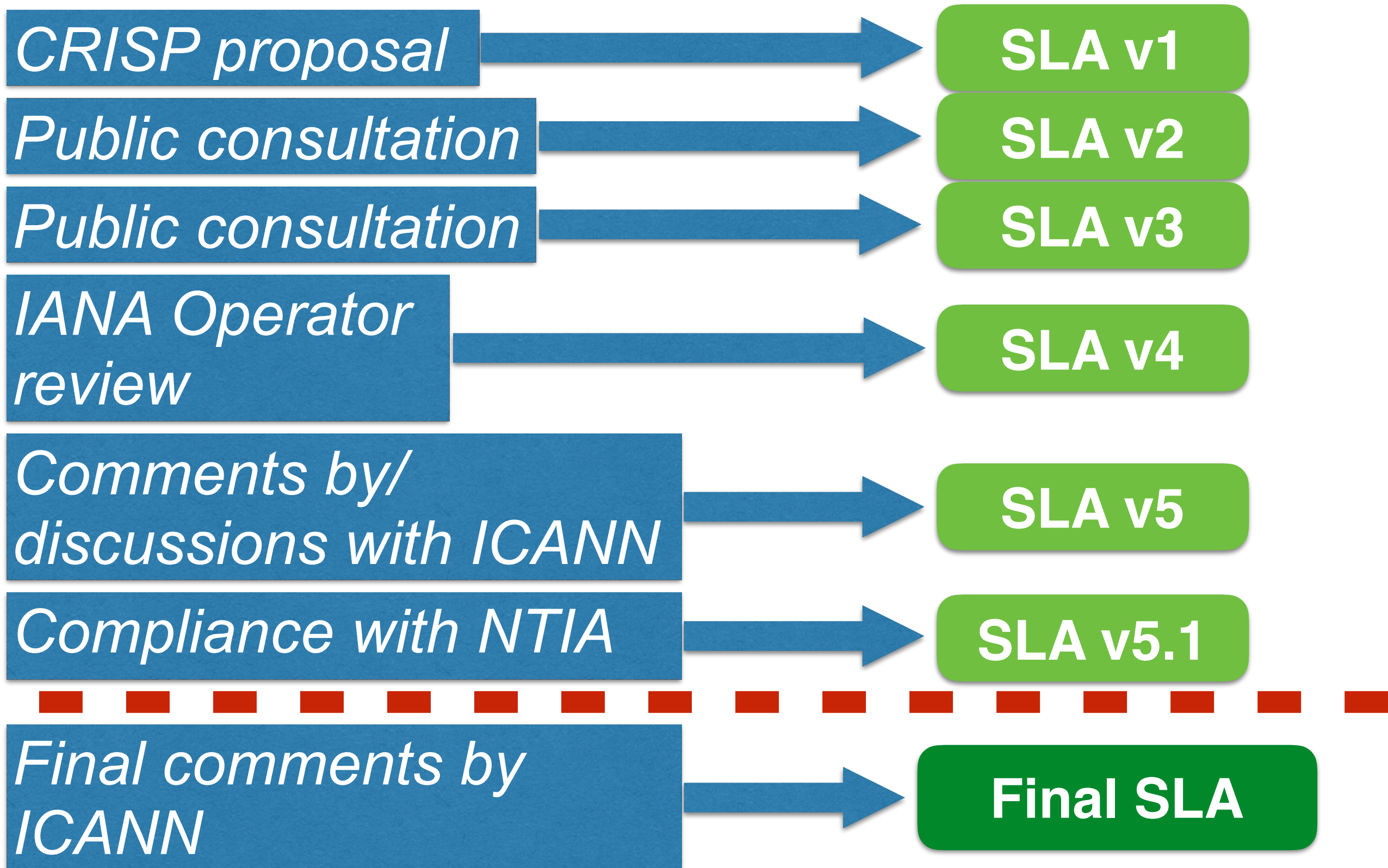
# SLA Discussions

- Every amendment was justified

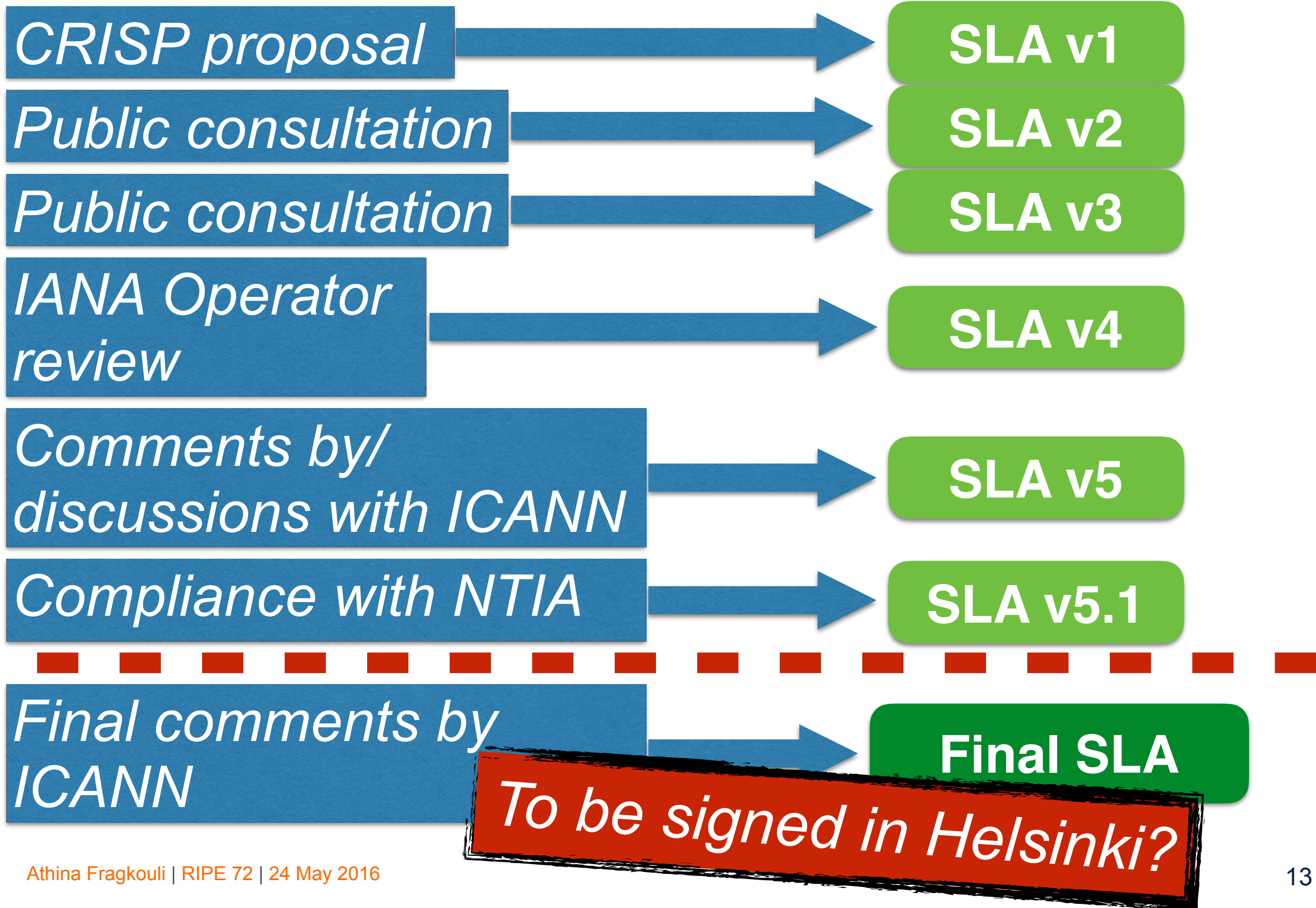

# Proposal Completed!!



- Approved by chartering organisations in Marrakech
  - ASO second to approve after RSSAC
  - Minority statement: the RIRs' SLA must be signed before the implementation of the proposed changes
- Submitted to ICANN Board together with ICG proposal
- Approved by ICANN Board
- Submitted to NTIA

# Next steps



- Implementation of the proposal
  - New ICANN bylaws drafted
  - ASO representatives submitted a supporting statement
  - Bylaws to be approved this week
- Accountability work after the IANA stewardship transition:
  - SO/ACs accountability (included in Work Stream 2)
