Policy proposal

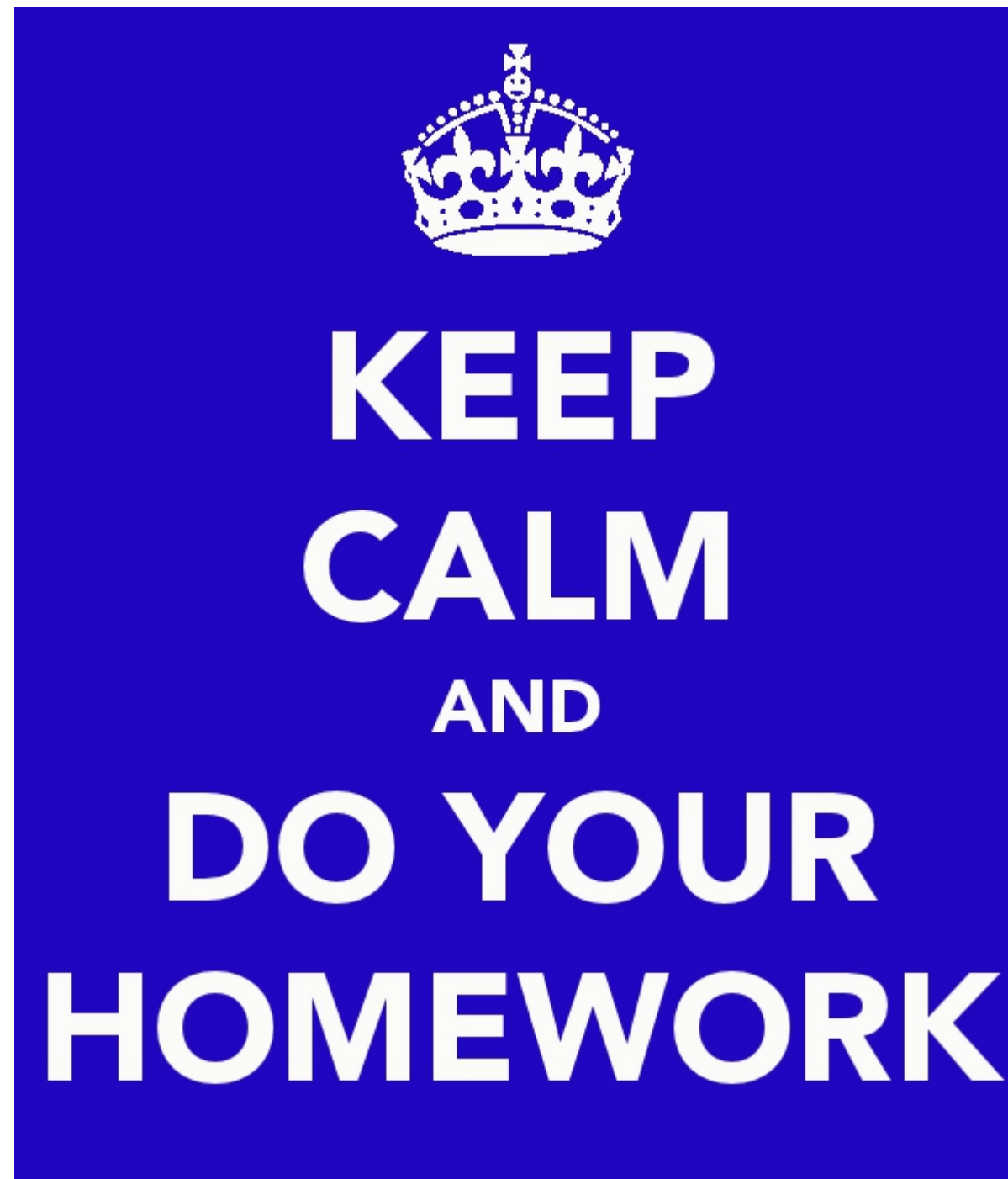
- In short : Create a single policy document, with all relevant policy text.

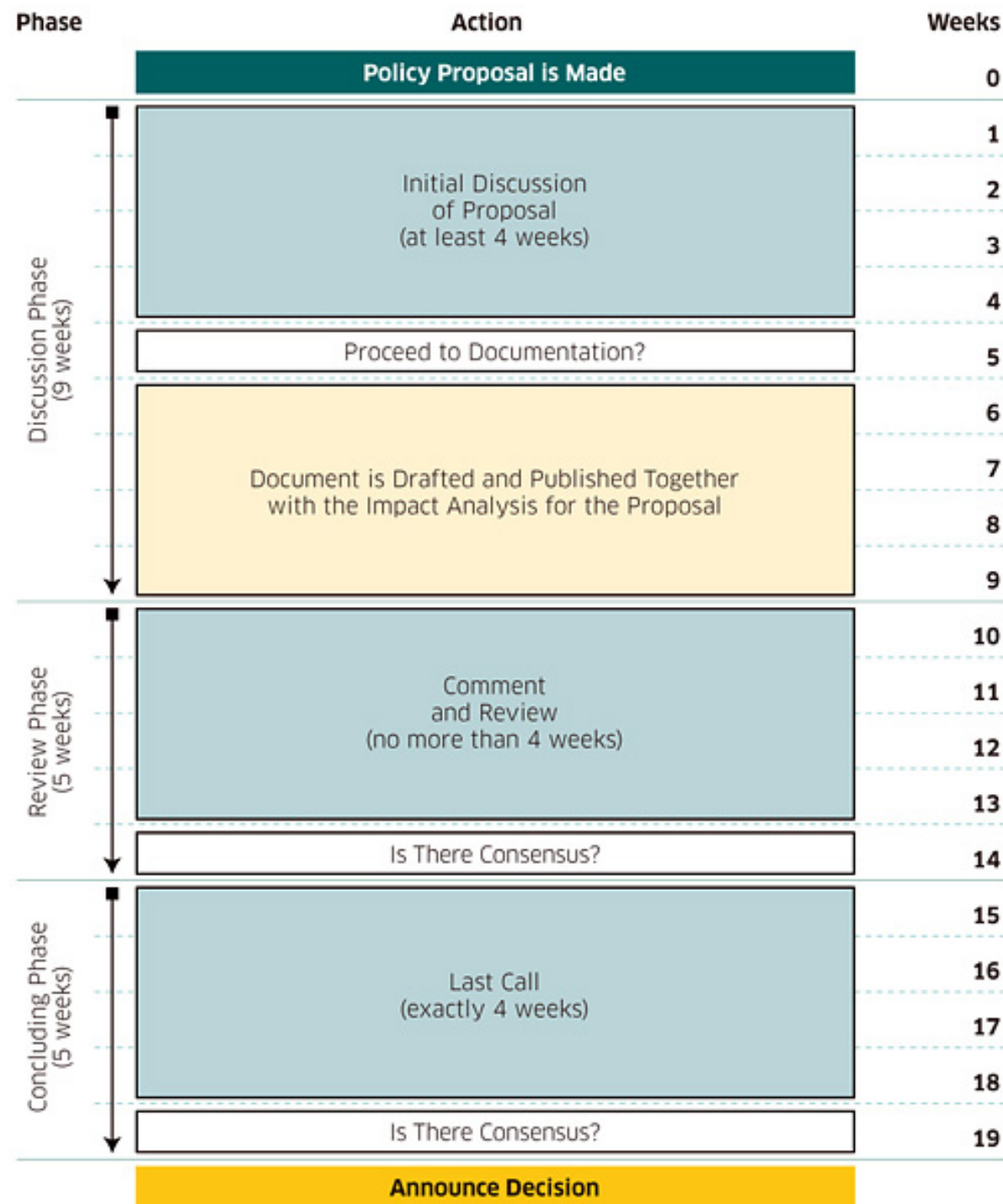
What we did after RIPE71
